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Biography

Dr Ong is a senior consultant psychiatrist at the Department of Developmental Psychiatry in IMH. He obtained his Masters in Medicine (Psychiatry) in 1999 and Graduate Diploma in Psychotherapy in 2001 from the National University of Singapore. Since his return in 2005 from a research fellowship in Columbia University, New York, he has been deeply engaged in outpatient services for children and adolescents with psychological problems and has conducted research work in mood disorders, schizophrenia and Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder (ADHD).

Besides being an adjunct professor in the three medical schools, he is also a core faculty of the National Psychiatry Residency Program in Singapore. In 2017, he was appointed Lead Psychiatrist in Lee Kong Chian School of Medicine and has been actively involved in teaching, mentoring as well as curriculum review and renewal for its undergraduate psychiatry modules.

Dr Ong has published over 30 articles in peer-reviewed journals, authored/edited four books and contributed several book chapters. Among some of more noteworthy publications in 2019/2020 included Traditional Chinese Medicine use in treatment of ADHD, Cyberbullying in Singapore adolescents, and a position paper in Lancet Psychiatry with the International Consortium of Health Outcomes Measurements (ICHOM). Collaborations with international and local partners in research included: Singapore Children Society and Turku University, Finland, 2015 - 2016; National Council of Social Service, 2016 – 2018.
